### WHAT IS A FAMILY-SCHOOL COMPACT?

A Title I Family-School compact is an agreement that explains how families and staff will work together to make sure all students reach and exceed grade level standards. The families and staff at each school annually discuss, review and this Title I Family-School compact.





Minnesota's English Language Arts (ELA) standards are taught in all classrooms, Kindergarten- 5th Grade with Benchmark Literacy Curriculum.

A Balanced Literacy framework is implemented including whole class and small group instruction, independent reading, word study and writing.

When extra support is needed, research-based interventions are provided.



**Bridges in Mathematics** is a comprehensive program which addresses the Minnesota Standards in a way that is enjoyable, engaging and accessible to all learners.

Students work on hands-on activities for exploring, developing, testing, discussing and applying concepts. The opportunity to solve problems in multiple ways helps students build more flexible and efficient problem solving strategies.

When extra support is needed, Bridges in Mathematics Intervention program is used.

We are committed to communicating regularly with families about student's learning. Communication from the school may include the following:

If you have questions about your child's progress, contact your child's teacher, or the Title I Lead teacher at your child's school.




